

# SAFEGUARDING POLICY STATEMENT FOR YARDLEY BAPTIST CHURCH

## Our vision/purpose:

The principal purpose of Yardley Baptist Church is the advancement of the Christian faith according to the principles of the Baptist denomination.

Yardley Baptist Church may also advance education and carry out other charitable purposes in the United Kingdom and/or other parts of the world.

In fulfilling this vision, we:

- Welcome children and adults at risk into the life of our community
- Have a program of activities for children and adults at risk
- Make our premises available to organisations working with children and adults at risk

## Our safeguarding responsibilities

The church recognises its responsibilities in safeguarding all children, young people and adults at risk, regardless of gender, ethnicity or ability, as set out in The Children Act 1989 and 2004, *Safe from Harm* (HM government 1994) and *Working Together to Safeguard Children* (HM government 2010).

As members of this church we commit ourselves to the nurturing, protection and safekeeping of all associated with the church and will pray for them regularly. In pursuit of this, we commit ourselves to this policy and to the development of sound procedures to ensure we implement our policy well.

- **Prevention and reporting of abuse**

It is the duty of each church member to help prevent the abuse of children and adults at risk, and the duty of each church member to respond to concerns about the well-being of children and adults at risk. Any abuse disclosed, discovered or suspected will be reported in accordance with our procedures. The church will fully cooperate with any statutory investigation into any suspected abuse linked with the church.

- **Safer recruitment, support and supervision of workers**

The church will exercise proper care in the selection and appointment of those working with children and adults at risk, whether paid or voluntary. All workers will be provided with appropriate training, support and supervision to promote the safekeeping of children and adults at risk.

- **Respecting children and adults at risk**

The church will adopt a code of behaviour for all who are appointed to work with children and adults at risk so that all children and adults are shown the respect that is due to them.

- **Safer working practices**

The church is committed to providing an environment that is as safe as possible for children and adults at risk and will adopt ways of working with them that promote their safety and well-being.

- **A safer community**

The church is committed to the prevention of bullying. The church will seek to ensure that the behaviour of any individuals who may pose a risk to children, young people and adults at risk in the community of the church is managed appropriately.

## **Safeguarding contact points within our church**

The church has appointed the following individuals to form part of the church safeguarding team:

### **Jo Green, Designated Person for Safeguarding (DPS)**

They will advise the church on any matters related to the safeguarding of children and adults at risk and take the appropriate action when abuse is disclosed, discovered or suspected.

They will assist the Designated Person for Safeguarding (DPS) in helping the church on any matters related to the safeguarding of children and adults at risk and take the appropriate action when abuse is disclosed, discovered or suspected.

## **Putting our policy into practice**

- A copy of the safeguarding policy statement will be displayed permanently on the church notice board and church office, and is available on our church website.
- Each worker with children and/or adults at risk will be given a full copy of the safeguarding policy and procedures and will be asked to sign to confirm that they will follow them.
- A full copy of the policy and procedures will be made available on request to any member of, or other person associated with the church.
- The policy and procedures will be monitored and reviewed annually, and any necessary revisions adopted into the policy and implemented through our procedures.
- The policy statement will be read annually at the church AGM, together with a report on the outcome of the annual safeguarding review.
- Renew Wellbeing safeguarding policy: The overarching charity Renew wellbeing who deliver training and support to each renew centre will help and train each church to update their policies to include their renew centres which will always come under the authority, oversight and safeguarding policies of the church. Renew Wellbeing agree to hold the same safe to Belong policy as the Baptist Union and all workers visiting projects and delivering training will be DBS checked. Renew Wellbeing work closely with council mental health teams and review training annually to be updated on all issues regarding safeguarding and mental health.
